CREATING YOUR OWN ASSESSMENT TASKS

Here are some things you can consider when creating an assessment task to assess student learning in a Digital Technologies context.

START WITH ACHIEVEMENT STANDARDS



Consult our statements of achievement; based on the AC: Digital Technologies achievement standards.



Which strand(s)? Knowledge and understanding and/or processes and production skills?



Check above and below the Year band you are assessing.

BLOOMS AND KEY ACTIVE VERBS



Each statement of achievement includes at least one key active verb ie. explain, design, evaluate.



We've linked these verbs to Bloom's Taxonomy; eg. to explain aligns with Bloom's 'understanding'.



Clarify what you are assessing and select an appropriate assessment task.





DIGITAL ASSESSMENTS

Draw or paint - identify (circle),
Describe (write), show
(sequence), model (mind map)



Label - identify, describe, recall



Image - identify (take photo of ...), demonstrate, sort, organise



Video - demonstrate, explain
